

# Practice and Training Test Visual Guide



This is the CAASPP Secure Browser for 2018.

Before double clicking this icon, please ensure no other programs are running, as the process will not progress until all programs are closed.

1. After ensuring no other applications are running, double click the CAASPP icon
2. The CAASPP browser will open and take the entire screen. No other interfaces will be accessible while CAASPP Secure Browser is open.
3. The first page will be the sign in dialog. Direct students to click on the “Practice and Training Test Site” link, as shown in the **RED** box below:

- If TA is logging into the Test Administrator Practice and Training Site to provide students a session ID, students uncheck the box next to Guest Session and enter Session ID provided by TA (students will all appear as “Guest” on TA screen).
- If TA is logging into the Test Administrator Practice and Training Site and wants the students to practice logging in with their credentials:
  - Have students uncheck the box next to Guest User and enter log-on information (first name exactly as in Aeries and SSID) and
  - Have the students uncheck the box next to Guest Session and enter Session ID provided by TA.

With headphones on, click on the center of the screen or the play arrow. If you hear a sound and see the animation (music notes float in), click the “I could play the video and sound”. If no sound is heard, please submit a Tech Request immediately. **Note: In 2018, a Sound/Video Check will appear prior to both the ELA and Math Practice or Training Tests.**

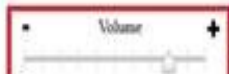

But in winter when food is scarce, moose eat more <sup>than</sup> ~~the~~ <sup>twigs and needles of balsam fir trees. They lose all the weight they gained in summer.

Wolves came to Isle Royale around 1950. Scientists think a mated pair probably walked across an ice bridge between the island and Canada. Wolves are the island's only big predators. Their arrival changed the lives of Isle Royale's moose forever.

**Ups and Downs**

Scientists have been studying this isolated food chain for 50 years to understand how changes in one link can cause changes in another. As more moose are born on the island, they eat more balsam fir. The more they consume, the more they damage the trees. Stunted trees mean less food. Eventually, there's not enough food to support all the moose. Many starve, and their numbers decrease. With fewer moose dining on them, fir trees gradually recover.

A similar boom-and-bust cycle occurs between predator and prey. Ten times the size of a wolf, a moose has long, strong legs and a dangerous kick. So wolves prey mainly on old and weak animals. Good hunting means food for the whole pack. Wolves then raise lots of pups, and their numbers increase. More wolves mean more mouths to feed and more moose get eaten. However, when the moose population decreases, wolves starve.

With fewer predators stalking the moose, more survive to old age. The moose population increases, and the cycle begins again.
