MEDICAL INSURANCE

For people who have suddenly lost their job and/or health insurance there are a few of options:

People who had health insurance through their job and no longer have that job are entitled to continued coverage under COBRA for at least 18 months; however, the premium for this coverage will be higher because the employer is no longer paying their part.

People who do not want to use COBRA may be able to buy coverage through Covered California (California's version of the Affordable Care Act). It is worth investigating because the federal financial assistance is augmented by new state subsidies available for Californians who make up to \$75,000 per year, or up to \$150,000 per year for a family of four. www.coveredca.com/see-if-you-qualify-for-financial-help/ Covered California has announced that anyone uninsured and eligible to enroll through the program can sign up through June 30. Call 800-300-1506 for more information.
